This morning on the 1st Sunday of Lent we celebrate the Truimph of Orthodoxy or the Sunday of Orthodoxy. In the 8th and early 9th century there arose a controversary over whether the Orthodox "worshipped" icons which would be a violation of the Ten Commandments where we are told that we are not to make any graven image to worship it. This controversy led to the Iconoclast Movement which took a false understanding that icons were being worshipped, led to the removal and destruction of all icons from the churches except the image of the Cross, and led to the persecution, exile and martyrdom of bishops, clergy and the faithful who rejected this false teaching. In 787 A.D. the 7th Ecumenical Councils rejected this false teaching and declared that Icons were venerated and not worshipped and that through the Incarnation Christ had come to sanctify all matter and so returned the right teaching about icons as an important part of the practice of our Orthodox Faith. But shortly after that, Iconoclasm arose again and with it another time of persecution of many. Finally at a local Council in Constantinople in 843 A.D. the proper understanding of icons was restored and on the 1st Sunday of Lent that year a great procession was made with the Holy Icons back into the Cathedral of Hagia Sophia in Constantinople. It was further decreed that from then on the 1st Sunday of Great Lent would be designated as the Triumph of Orthodoxy or the Sunday of Orthodoxy. So in imitation of this today we also affirm our Orthodox Faith the Procession of Holy Icons.

This morning during Divine Liturgy-between the Gospel Reading and the Sermon-we administer the oath of office to the new and returning members of our Parish Executive Board. Let us all pray together for our Executive Board as it works together with each of us to guide the ministry and work of our Parish community!

During Great Lent an integral and important part of our Lenten journey is the celebration Memorial Saturdays, special days give to us by our Holy Church to commemorate the faithful departed of our parish communities and our families. We will offer this special service during Great Lent on Saturday, March 23, Saturday, March 30, and Saturday, April 6. Let us all submit the names of our departed loved ones and family members that they can all be commemorated in this special way.

Everyone is invited to come out to help again with our next Parish Pirohi Sale on Thursday/Friday, March 21/22. Let us all join together as we work for the good of our Parish in this way.

We encourage everyone to continue to give generously to our Capital Improvements Fund as we continue to work on the different projects of maintaining and updating our Parish buildings.
