programs for children orphaned and displaced by the Russian Federation's

invasion of Ukraine. Each program brings 50-53 children mostly from south and

east Ukraine for an intensive ten-day program in Zamlynnya Ukraine near the

Polish border where they work with psychologists, medical doctors, master

artists, and therapists to deal with the traumatic stress from which they suffer and

to build life skills to carry them into the future as capable, productive young

people who will rebuild their lives and their country.
